
















CHILDREN & YOUNG PEOPLE'S CLASSES

1st prize: £15; 2nd: £10; 3rd: £5





RULES FOR EXHIBITORS



1. All entry forms must be returned to the Entry Secretary /telephoned through or emailed by Tuesday, September 3 2019, unless otherwise stated.

2. No person may enter more than one exhibit in the same class.

3. Exhibits must be staged either between 7pm and 8pm on Friday September 6, or 8.30am to 10.30am on Saturday September 7, 2019.

4. No exhibits or award cards may be removed until after the distribution of cups and prizes that will commence at 4.30pm.

5. All exhibits in classes 1- 53 must be produced at the exhibitor's own premises. The Committee reserves the right to verify this. Only one entry can be accepted from each household.

6. Root vegetables in Section 1 are to be exhibited with tops not exceeding 5".

7. All exhibits in Sections 6 to 7 must be the work of the exhibitor.

8. Although all possible care will be taken, the committee cannot be held responsible for any loss or damage.

9. Exhibitors not complying with the rules will be disqualified.

10. Exhibitors not up to the standard of a 1st prize can be awarded 2nd or 3rd prize at the discretion of the judges.

11. Points will be awarded thus - 1st = 3 pts, 2nd = 2 pts, 3rd = 1 pt.

12. Any complaint must be made in writing to the Secretary within seven days.

13. Decision of Judges will be final in all matters; judges' comments are personal opinions.

14. It is recommended that for reasons of hygiene cookery entries be covered whilst on display.

15. All cookery, preserves and beverages will be tasted.

16. Entrants in Class 58 must not have won a 1st, 2nd or 3rd prize in a flower arranging competition at the show or elsewhere and consider themselves a novice.

Points awarded will not be added into flowercraft section.




