#### Letter from the Rectory

As I write this it is a glorious evening after a sunny day, a couple of days before the Prime Minister is due to make an announcement about whether or not restrictions will be lifted on June 21st. Sitting here at the Rectory, looking out across the Corvedale, it could be difficult to believe that there is anything wrong, or that as a nation we continue to face pandemic-related uncertainty. And yet, as we know, the latest variant in the virus brings rising case numbers in some parts of the country and in many parts of the world the situation is far more uncertain than it is here.

If you look at the church service pattern for the month you will notice that on July 18th we have a group service at Abdon, something we would normally do on the fifth Sunday of the month when there is one. This date for a group service was selected because it is the Sunday nearest to St Margaret's Day and Abdon Church is dedicated to St Margaret. There were, in fact, several saints called Margaret and we are not certain to which of them the church is dedicated – July 20th is the feast day of St Margaret of Antioch. Looking at the lives of several of the saints named Margaret one of the things that strikes me is the uncertainty of the times in which they lived, a reminder that for most of history people have lived in what could be described as uncertain times – much more so than the

periods of prolonged stability throughout society. If we look just at our own lives, and not on a global or national level, we still find periods of uncertainty – as we await the outcome of exams or interviews, as we wonder what to do in the next stage of our lives or careers, or when accidents or illness take things in ways we did not want or plan to go and in many other ways too.

Whilst there are those who think that faith in God means that people of faith are somehow immune from the uncertainties of life, this is not the case. Christians, or people of other faiths, are just as likely to face uncertain times in life as anyone else. What is perhaps different is that through faith in God we know that there are certainties to which we can hold on - God's love for his people is unchanging and constant. It doesn't necessarily change what happens to us, but it can change how we see it and how we feel about it. Writing to the church in Corinth, St Paul wrote what can be seen is temporary, but what cannot be seen is eternal (2 Corinthians 4, 18). Just as the love of God was there for the early Christians living with the everpresent threat of persecution for their beliefs, so it is there for us - in all the ups, downs, certainties and uncertainties of the times in which we find ourselves.

#### Corvedale Book Group

#### How to be both by Ali Smith

A much praised and prize-winning book from 2014/15 *How to be both* is a thought provoking read. It reminded me of the T.S. Eliot quote from the first stanzas of Burnt Norton.

Time present and time past Are both perhaps present in time future, And time future contained in time past. If all time is eternally present All time is unredeemable.

*How to be both* was published in two versions - one starting with the story of Georgia, a teenager whose mother has recently died, and the other beginning with a disembodied spirit observing a boy looking at a painting in an art gallery.

The edition we received from the library began with 'George' and moved on to the life of the 15th century artist Francesco del Cossa. The essence of the story is about how time collides and elides, how it is multi-layered and how the present has an impact on the past and the past on the present: how you cannot have one without the other.

'George' is an introspective teenager, pedantic about grammar, who lives with her mother and father and younger brother Henry. Her mother is a writer with a history of being able to subvert internet documents with challenging statements and images. She believes she is being watched by the intelligence services. Sadly, she suddenly dies, and

we see the family unravel as her husband takes to drink, Henry is lost, and George struggles to understand the simultaneous presence and absence of her mother in her life. George undergoes a number of counselling sessions with Mrs Rock, the school counsellor, which give her space to progress through her emotions.

Shortly before her death, the mother took the children to Ferrara to see a picture she had read about by the artist Francesco del Cossa whose work came to light when a letter was discovered in which he asked the Duke for an and frame that reality. In her mourning George discovers other sides to the mother she thought she knew, including an obsessional relationship with another woman. George has a developing relationship with a school friend, Helena, who helps to bring her out of her grief.
 In the other half of the story, the painter is transported to the present and observes the strange world of the 21st century and follows George around as his/her story is revealed. The painter's mother also died early and her father, a brick layer, disguised her as a boy so she could make best use of her obvious artistic talents. We learn of her education, growing independence, commissions and sexual

### Munslow Parish Community Speed Watch (CSW)

**New Volunteers:** I am happy to report that several more residents along the B4368 have said that they are interested in volunteering for Speed Watch training. I'm sure that Mark Booth, our West Mercia Police liaison officer, will do his best to organise training asap.

**CSW Sessions:** Unfortunately, we are still recording too many speeding drivers including two vehicles with a horse trailer and a coach. Most of the speeding vehicles recorded were small commercial vehicles. Recently, a resident and her dog were almost knocked down in the road as they were crossing by The Swan in Aston Munslow. The road was empty and suddenly a speeding vehicle appeared from around the bend. I'm sure that all too many of us are familiar with similar experiences along the B4368 so the Munslow Parish CSW team will continue to do its bit to raise road safety awareness amongst all the drivers and riders.

West Mercia Police Speed Awareness Campaign: During July and August, a couple of weeks will be dedicated to this campaign. To support our Munslow Parish CSW team, Mark has offered to arrange for a police colleague to join our sessions. Also, we can expect an increased presence of West Mercia Police Road Safety Awareness teams patrolling Shropshire roads during this campaign.

**Noise:** Excessive noise from some motorbikes, as riders test the performance of their machines along the B4368, continues to be an ongoing concern for residents and holiday makers in the Corvedale. Any incidents which we hear about are passed on to Mark Booth.

**NPCC National Seatbelt & Mobile Phone Campaign:** Plans for how our CSW team can be involved with this initiative are still to be confirmed.

#### The Corvedale Kitchen

#### **Chocolate Orange Loaf**

#### Ingredients

- 150g soft unsalted butter plus some extra for greasing
- 2 tbsp golden syrup
- 175g dark muscovado sugar
- 150g plain flour

# You will need

A 900g (2lb) loaf tin

#### Method

- 1. Preheat oven to 170°C / gas mark 3. Grease and line your loaf tin with baking parchment.
- 2. Beat the already soft butter with the syrup and the sugar until you have a fairly smooth caffe Americano cream, though the sugar will always have a bit of grit about it (wet mixture).

 $\frac{1}{2}$  tsp

25g

2

bicarbonate of soda

zest of 2 regular oranges and juice of 1

eggs

best quality cocoa powder, sifted

- 3. Mix the flour, bicarbonate of soda and cocoa powder and beat 1 tablespoon of the dry ingredients into the wet mixture.
- 4. Beat 1 egg into the wet mixture, followed by 2 tablespoons of the dry ingredients, the remaining egg and then the last of the dry mix.
- 5. Whilst still beating the mix, add the orange zest and gradually add the juice (if the batter looks dimpled, don't worry, it isn't curdled!).
- 6. Pour the mix into the lined loaf tin and bake for 45 mins but check after 40 mins. The cake tester shouldn't come out entirely clean as the cake is meant to be a little moist.
- 7. Leave to cool in the tin and then turn out on a wire rack.

### Footpath Maintenance Group

We are right out of stock for stiles and steps at the moment, but for April we had just enough to put in a dog friendly

stile at Munslow, our very first! Hopefully, we'll be able to do more. The stile in the field off the track at Rowe Lane is now complete and it is possible to walk from Munslow through to the little nature reserve off Rowe Lane. From Munslow, leaving Greenyard, follow the



footpath east across the Millichope estate, cross the lane at Beambridge and down to the B4368. Take care crossing this busy road! The path is straight across the field, over a footbridge, then diagonally left across a couple of fields to come out onto the BOAT (Byway Open to All Traffic) at Rowe Lane. Turn right down the track a short distance to the ford and immediately after the ford a footpath goes left and takes you passed the reserve. If you're a birder, take binoculars as the birds are usually a little distance away, near the water.

We were also able to help our Footpaths Officer from Shropshire Council to replace a couple of footbridges at Brookhampton (one more to do there) and in May we repaired a footbridge SE of Munslow near Brook House, on a footpath that goes on towards Baucott Farm. Many of the boards needed to be replaced, also the steps at each end and a post at the south end to enable walkers to get on and off the bridge.

The Corvedale Three Castles Walk is our 'flagship' route, as assisting John Farley in setting up this walk (nearly 20 years ago!) is how our group began. Recently, there was a problem on a 'permissive' stretch of the route which passes through Honeydene Farm near Diddlebury. Over time, new buildings have been erected and the walk seemed to fizzle



out somewhere in the farmyard, making it unsafe for both walkers and the farm. With the consent of the landowner, we re-routed the path to avoid the farmyard altogether, so it now goes along a field following the ditch, crosses a brand new 14-foot sleeper type footbridge (extremely heavy work!) to pick up the bridleway across the corner of the next field.

While we await a delivery of stock for replacement stiles, we will spend our time attempting to clear the explosion of growth around existing stiles. Happy walking!

#### **Corvedale School**

Following an extraordinary general meeting for parents of children attending the Corvedale Centre for Children (CCfC), a decision was made to transfer control of the setting to the school. The Corvedale Centre for Children's registration was suspended by Ofsted following an inspection back in April and has been temporarily managed by the school since then.

Everyone who has been involved in the CCfC over the past few decades will be very aware of the fantastic amount of work, time and commitment undertaken by Colin Jones and his staff in order to build up such a reputable and wellloved provision for the community.

The demands of volunteer committee members which manages the setting, has increased quite significantly in recent years and previous committees have been struggling to cope. With a turnover of children through the preschool every year came the demands of recruiting new busy mums and dads onto the committee. This resulted in enormous pressure on staff to maintain the significant challenges of operating the CCfC with little knowledgeable support.

Current temporary provision of the preschool will continue under the management of the school till the end of term. During that time the CCfC staff and committee, school



setting under the 'umbrella' management of Corvedale Primary School. We at the school, have been given the support from the local authority and Ofsted, to offer preschool provision for 3 and 4-year-olds and for children in the term after their 2nd birthday. We would like to hear from anyone who would like to register for a place at our preschool in September. This letter was going to include our plans for the end of term but following the announcement of the delayed end to restrictions we are having to re-evaluate plans and await guidance from the local authority.

#### **A E Housman** (1859 - 1936)

Alfred Edward Housman was an English classical scholar and poet. His cycle of poems, A Shropshire Lad wistfully evoke the dooms and disappointments of youth in the English countryside. Their simplicity and distinctive imagery appealed strongly to Edwardian taste, and to many early 20th-century English composers both before and after the First World War. Through their songsettings, the poems became closely associated with that era, and with Shropshire itself.

Housman was one of the foremost classicists of his age and has been ranked as one of the greatest scholars who ever lived. He established his reputation publishing as a private scholar and, on the strength and quality of his work, was appointed Professor of Latin at University College, London and then at the University of Cambridge. His editions of Juvenal, Manilius and Lucan are still considered authoritative.

### Dog fouling

#### PLEASE CLEAR UP AFTER YOUR DOG.

There has been a notable increase in dog fouling throughout the Corvedale and especially in and around Diddlebury village. Whilst most dog owners are responsible citizens and clear up after their dogs there are obviously some people who are not adhering to the law.

Dog fouling is not only deeply unpleasant, it is dangerous. Whilst rare, contact with dog excrement can cause toxocariasis - a nasty infection that can lead to dizziness, nausea, asthma and even blindness or seizure and can cause salmonella in cattle.

Anyone who fails to clear up after their dog can be issued with a Fixed Penalty Notice of up to **£100**. If the case goes to court this could cost the owner up to **£1,000**. The law states that being unaware a dog has fouled or not having a suitable bag is not a reasonable excuse.

#### **Corvedale Past and Present**



#### 'Everybody out, everybody out, just who does he think he is? Everybody out, everybody out...'

Well, those of you of a certain age will be able to fill in the rest from the words of the comic song that did the rounds in 60s or 70s, all about unions and lightning strikes that were then very much order of the day.

Now then, we know everything that goes around comes around, but a lightning strike in 1163? Yes, it happened and on our doorstep, and it is a truly remarkable tale. What is more it was almost without precedent for that period: I understand that only a very few scattered places in France and Italy saw the same type of thing in 1100s and 1200s AD. The '*villeins*' rose up and, in the context of the times, it was a very bold move indeed.

This little article is far too short to explain who the 'villeins' were, but the association with the modern word 'villain' is unfortunate. They comprised easily the biggest group in society and they were effectively serfs 'owned' by their lord, though they had some of the lord's land which they worked to keep themselves and families alive. They had no rights of leaving their own village and were true bondsmen. Their descendants were the rural poor, the copyhold tenants of later ages.

The Prior of Wenlock at the time, one Humbald, was the lord of a lot of the land that today we inhabit around the Brown Clee and in the Corvedale, and, to be brutally honest, you do have to wonder about his motives, and his, and his fellow-monks' tactics.

The villeins who lived under 'My Lord Prior' did have a lot to put up with. In a good year they might harvest 5 grains of wheat for every one sown in the ground. They might have

had an ox to plough, a cow and a few sheep, and probably a vegetable patch around their dwellings. They might 'get by' till the man of the house died when the Prior would claim his best beast as death duty, which was called, a 'heriot'.

Wenlock, rather unusually, went further, much further – and claimed a 'terciar', a third of all of a man's possessions. So when poor old Richard of [Cold] Weston 'shuffled off this mortal', on The Feast of the Transition of St Milburga (23rd February) in 1379, the sharp-eyed court assessor, as well as going off with a third of all of his stuff, noticed a ploughshare and claimed a third of the metal for 'My Lord Prior'!

All this sort of thing, not surprisingly, got too much for the poor villeins

and in 1163 it all boiled over. The men in the fields threw down their ploughshares and presumably marched on The Priory, as reports of monks being 'hurt' appeared (what constituted being 'hurt' for a monk, one suspects, may have been somewhat different from the rest of the population!) Whatever really happened, we know that the Prior called in the local 'knights' to quell the disturbance. This was serious indeed: the knight was the tank of the day. Nevertheless, the disturbances seemed to go on for a few days before some sort of compromise was thrashed out.

Yet it was shocking. Such a thing was unheard of, and as far as I know did not occur again in England until the Peasants' Revolt over 200 years later when the disturbances were on a huge scale and threatened the whole structure of the country (the phrase of course came much later the peasants did not know they were revolting!).

To come back to 1163 – how do we know these remarkable events took place? When the dust had settled the monks of Wenlock wrote a letter to their Cluniac 'mother house' in France. '*We would rather die than give in to them*', was the sentiment the monks expressed when they had a little time to let their better side come to the fore. And the name of the French mother house? La Charité sur Loire. You may think that somewhat ironic: I, of course, could not possibly comment.
