Letter from the Rectory

At the end of this month we will mark St Michael's Day (September 29th), the patronal festival of Munslow Church. The church has a red altar frontal which reminds us of this dedication to St Michael featuring, amongst other images, a large pair of scales. We see the image of a pair of scales in connection with justice, reminding us of balance and of the need to weigh the evidence. The ancient Egyptians believed that the dead were judged by Anubis, who weighed their heart against a feather. Based at least in part on a verse in the Book of Jude in which Michael and the devil argue over the body of Moses, the tradition developed that Michael would weigh the souls of the dead on the day of judgement. This is sometimes shown in medieval paintings, with the devil attempting to affect the balance of the scales.

As saints go, Michael is unusual. We might think of the Communion of Saints - the spiritual union of all members of the Christian Church, living and dead. We might think, too, of saints as people who have lived lives of particular holiness. Michael, however, doesn't fit into either of these categories - he is an archangel. He is one of four angels named in the Bible, along with Gabriel, Raphael and Uriel. He is mentioned in the Book of Daniel and in the Revelation to John, where he is described as the leader of the armies of God and is known for his victory over the dragon which represented the power of evil. He is shown defeating the dragon in the window at the west end of the aisle in Munslow Church.

As I write, the news is filled with the situation in Afghanistan, a situation which will no doubt have moved on by the time you read this. Thinking about this in the context of St Michael and his victory over the powers of evil I am reminded of the phrase 'The only thing necessary for the triumph of evil is for good men to do nothing' - a quote often attributed to Edmund Burke, but more likely based on a comment by the Victorian philosopher John Stuart Mill. St Michael with his scales perhaps reminds us that we all have a part to play in the defeat of the power of evil. There are, of course, situations about which we can do nothing - none of us is likely to be able to resolve the situation in Afghanistan - but there are also situations in which we can play a part. We can play a part too, through prayer, asking for God's help in situations both large and small, in those places where we can play an active part and also those where we cannot.

Caring for God's Acre



What a difference a year or so can make. The Churchyard Task Team (CTT), part of Caring for God's Acre, the charity that protects the unique environments of our churchyards and burial grounds, has had a challenging

time. Workdays have been cancelled, numbers of members curbed and many churchyards have not been getting their usual visitors.

You do not have to be a CTT member to know the rules, frustrations and isolation of Covid-19 - we have all had these experiences during lockdown. But what about our burial grounds - how have they fared over the same time? No church services means very few visitors and far less mowing and, in some cases, understandably, complete neglect.

Earlier this summer, the CTT turned up to work in Stoke St Milborough, in South Shropshire. As each volunteer arrived, their faces all assumed the same sequence of expressions: shock, which gave way to amazement, which turned into a joyful smile. The grass was looking really healthy, the buttercups were like yellow spots scattered on the green carpet. But what were those spindly white competitors? For how many years have they been waiting? How many times had they tried to push up through the soil only to be cut back and cut off long before their prime?

If that was a surprise, the next vision was a tall pink spike, standing proud of the grass. Could it really be an orchid? Yes, it could - a common orchid, but an orchid nonetheless! And there was another one in a separate part of the burial ground.

Pete is the CTT person tasked with recording whatever wildlife we can identify. It is not an exhaustive system, but we do our best. Our finds this time had us all excited. The 'neglect' had produced many more and different flowers and several varieties of bees buzzed between them.



It was good for all of us as we returned to normal CTT service that something so positive could come out of such a challenging time. Nature took the opportunity to make its best show ever. Now what will we find at our next churchyards? Look out for the last of the oxeye daisies, knapweed, betony, scabious, toadflax, ladies bedstraw, harebells, yarrow and wild carrot.

In South Shropshire, look out for us at in Worfield on 2nd September, Stoke St Milborough on the 8th, Norton (on the Welsh border near Presteigne) on the 14th, Claverley on the 16th, Bishop's Castle on the 21st, Billingsley on the 23rd and Stanton Lacy on the 28th of the month. As you can see, we do get about.

Munslow Village Hall AGM

Munslow Village Hall AGM held at Beambridge Clubroom on 27th July 2021.

The usual small group of supporters attended a subdued AGM. Ever hopeful, it was anticipated that there might be one or two new faces, but it was not to be. However, we were pleased to welcome Barbara Archer, representing Munslow Parish Council.

As with societies and councils up and down the country, public meetings had been cancelled and strict new measures had to be introduced before venues could reopen this July. Like most village halls, we had benefitted from the receipt of a grant made by Shropshire Council to mitigate the loss of income and to subsidise the measures required to protect the public from Covid-19. The Treasurer, Christine Evans, reported that financially the Clubroom is in a safe position for the moment, despite the continuing problem of hefty electricity charges.

Currently, the Clubroom is on a 21-year lease from the Millichope Estate, which is due for renewal in 2023. The Estate is taking the opportunity to review the leasehold and discussions are taking place about transferring it to

the Millichope Foundation. There is a certain logic to this decision, as both the Clubroom and the Foundation are registered charities.

Following the formal business of the AGM the attention of attendees was drawn to the pressing need to involve new parishioners in the running of the hall and in maintaining it as an attractive venue for parish meetings. The building is Grade II listed and much has been done in the past, by a small band of local volunteers, to create an attractive meeting room. The facilities include a well-equipped kitchen for catering; just before the pandemic, a new electric cooker was installed. Further improvements being considered are the removal of noisy, inefficient overhead heaters and the fitting of a satellite dish to provide an internet connection.

The committee next meets on Tuesday, 14th September at 7.30pm. New faces from the parish would be most welcome.

Munslow Parish Community Speed Watch (CSW)

Once again, the summer weather, holiday season and diversions have increased the traffic along the B4368. We hope that our continuing Munslow Parish Speed Watch sessions and increased West Mercia Police presence succeed in raising Road Safety awareness amongst local as well as visiting drivers and riders to the Corvedale Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty.

West Mercia August Speed Campaign: Our team has done well to organise extra CSW sessions at various police approved sites in Munslow during this campaign and we have welcomed several visits from our support team at West Mercia Police. Unfortunately, during 6-13 August, 73 speeders were recorded of which 53 were doing 40+mph and 9 doing 50+mph upon entering Munslow village.

New Recording Sheets: West Mercia Police Road Safety Team will soon be introducing a new digital recording system for all CSW teams in the county. It should improve the monitoring and recording of our data which can then be used as evidence to present to the Parish Council and to Shropshire Highways with a view to accessing grants and installing effective traffic calming measures.

Hedges: Overgrown hedges at the entrance to Munslow village continue to pose a serious road safety problem by obscuring the 30mph signs, despite the problem being reported to Shropshire Highways and being posted on the 'Fix my Street' website.

Snow White's 4 Dwarves: Fiona Fylan (reader in sustainable behaviour at Leeds Becket University) recently conducted extensive research into the causes of speeding. She identified 4 different groups of offenders, with most drivers falling into the first 2 groups.

1. The 'Sleepy' Group

Don't know they are speeding. Either they don't know what the limit is or their speed has crept up and they haven't realised.

2. The 'Dopey' Group

They do know they are speeding but think just a few miles over the limit doesn't make much difference.

3. The 'Grumpy' Group

Populated largely by middle aged men who know that they are speeding by quite a margin but tend to believe their experience mitigates any risk.

4. The 'Happy' Group

They know that they are speeding but are happy to acknowledge the risks. They are speeding for the thrill of it.

Oh dear! I know which group I still tend to fall into. Which one are you in?

Fiona's recent research also suggests that because of the 'dramatic developments in the design and performance of cars...there will always be people who speed because they think that they can do so safely'. However, as I was reminded by one of our West Mercia Police colleagues, no matter how easy it is to accelerate and brake in modern cars, the driver is still totally responsible for its speed.

It is particularly common along the banks of watercourses including the Diddle Brook and the River Corve. More information is available via the following link:

After flowering between June and October, the plant forms seed heads which explode when disturbed, scattering the seeds up to 7 metres. If you see these plants, please do pull them up to help prevent the spread of this pernicious weed. The plants come up quite easily including the roots. It is best to leave the pulled plants on site.

Corvedale Past and Present

An exciting weekend at Heath – 24th to 26th July

Well, it's taken a long time in the planning, and the happenings of last year meant that the event was a year later than anticipated. It was also quite complicated, with lots of people and organisations to talk to and get permission from.

As Tim and I opened (de-turfed) eight test pits on the Friday morning, Tim talked on his mobile phone to numerous archaeological colleagues. I expected the conversations to be about the deeper aspects of medieval archaeology, but they mostly talked about cake! Just as vital, as I was to learn.

If the study of deserted sites in this part of the world were a jigsaw, I knew we could at best add just a piece or two to what is an almost empty board.

The best thing about the weekend was the people! We were very lucky to have a veritable team of professional archaeologists from the Worcestershire unit. There were eleven all told, all highly experienced 'diggers', but many of them also having another string to their archaeological bow. Tim and Fiona were also building specialists, Liz is a luminary in the ecology of ancient landscapes, Tegan looks after records at Worcester, whilst Rob was our extraordinary ceramics expert....and so on. To this heady mix we added Trevor, a retired academic from Oxford University and a Shropshire man who has almost unparalleled experience of interpreting the historic countryside. He has written extensively about this area and is my mentor. We were also visited by a number of 'locals' who are very knowledgeable, and on Sunday by John and Bridget, who also live locally but, additionally, have had distinguished careers of national importance in museum curation and historic architecture. They gave some of us a fascinating insight into the interior of Heath Chapel.

What a collection of talent!

The weekend's work was the digging of the eight 'test pits'. I suppose that the clue to the activity is in the name 'test'. This is never likely to produce detailed information about a particular location, but is more of a sampling procedure to ascertain the nature of finds that every location yields up. The whole site of the ancient village is comfortably more than 12 acres, so as you can imagine, 8 pits of each 1 metre by 1 metre is a tiny representation of the whole.

'So, what did you find then?' is the natural question! For the moment I will duck that bouncer (a cricket analogy), by saying the finds are still being analysed. The real answer might be what the finds tell us about the 'material culture' of the people who lived in the village. I hope you won't mind if I use an analogy from my own age. If you were presented with the front bumper from a Ford Anglia car you might easily recognise it for what it was (having seen thousands of the things), and might even know roughly in which year it was produced, though you might have a crafty look at a period manual to confirm your assumptions. Now, if you know, by other means, a great deal about the 1960s, that front bumper might suddenly mean a great deal more. You might even have ideas about what sort of people might have owned such a car, so the possible significance of a single, matter-of-fact artefact could quickly grow.

Could the same principle be applied to an object which came out of the ground after eight centuries? Well, yes, it could. Obviously, the connection is less secure after all those years, but the principle is the same. An expert such as Rob could identify a type of pot and age it by its style just from a fragment. There is lots of evidence to back this up; for instance a huge amount of pottery from an extensive dig in Shrewsbury Castle forms an invaluable Shropshire reference and I know that Rob is checking against medieval pottery that's been unearthed in Ludlow from the same period.

One particular piece of ceramics especially intrigued me, a very attractive piece of pot, a fragment from the 13th century which Rob very confidently asserted was from a large pitcher which would have been used to fill other pots and drinking vessels. It came from an interesting part of the site, which I felt ought to be the place where the crofts and tofts of the peasant families were situated. It looks quite fine. Intriguingly, have we here a family on the long trek from serfdom to an independent and even prosperous way of life? This is perhaps ridiculous based on a single piece of pottery, from a tiny sample of a large site, but these were after all, 'test pits'!

There is a plan to present an explanation of the finds for anyone who's interested when the full story is available, so please keep an eye out for that announcement in your wonderful local magazine if this sort of thing interests you!

Diddlebury Parish Council

Diddlebury Parish Council pays tribute to the public service given by four ex-councillors

Following the elections on 6th May 2021 Diddlebury Parish Council lost four councillors. At the parish council meeting held on 28th July 2021 in Diddlebury Village Hall the Chairman thanked those councillors for all the public service they had given to the parish and wider community over the years and awarded Certificates of Service to Mr Mervyn Thomas, Mrs Kath Worthington, Mr Mike Woodhouse and Mrs Selina Thomas.

Mervyn Thomas had served as a councillor for so long that the relevant records of his appointment have long been archived but it was reckoned to be at least 30 years of unbroken service. His attendance record at meetings was regular and we estimate he probably clocked up 300 meetings at around two hours each: that's a lot of hours to put in. He brought a wealth of experience and knowledge of both farming and local issues to our meetings and we will miss him.

Kath Worthington joined DPC in 2007. She always had an interest in things which directly affected residents, such as making sure the Buzzard was supported and also the Louisa Powell almshouses. When Westhope Village Hall faced difficulties following Tom Hall's death, along with Amie Watson Kath stepped up to the plate and took on the role of treasurer. She was also involved with the Corvedale News for many years. Kath brought many local issues to the parish council meetings for its consideration and aired her views on a range of matters. Despite her aversion to computers, she persevered throughout lockdown and found ways to engage with DPC meetings during the Zoom era.

Selina Thomas was voted onto DPC in 2013 and she became closely involved with the working of the Parish Plan Steering Group. At parish council meetings she was always a forceful and articulate speaker especially on issues involving housing and the environment. We are sorry that she has moved away and wish her well in her new life.

Mike Woodhouse (who joined in May 2017) was mainly interested in Diddlebury Village Hall but he also contributed to all aspects of council business. The fact that he had the time for this considering his personal workload and other demands on his time is a testament to his public service commitment. Mike spoke strongly on issues and championed causes he felt deeply about, often making thought provoking comments. He carries on with his public work through his Diddlebury Village Hall commitments: the renovated hall is testament to his work in particular.

Parish Councils

DIDDLEBURY PARISH COUNCIL

Summary of the draft Minutes of Diddlebury Parish Council's Meeting held on Wednesday 28th July 2021 at Diddlebury Village Hall

Present: Cllr D Hedgley (Chairman), Cllrs T O'Boyle, G Neden, R Povall, A Watson, T Pardoe, A Rattu and R Morgan. Apologies were received and accepted from Cllr S Povall.

In Attendance: The Clerk, Shropshire Cllr Cecilia Motley, and six members of the public.

Presentation of Certificates of Service: The Chairman presented Mr Mervyn Thomas and Mrs Kath Worthington with Certificates of Service, and Certificates will also be sent to Mr Mike Woodhouse and Mrs Selina Thomas. The Certificates are a testament to the public service given by those ex-councillors to the Diddlebury community.

Declarations of Interest were made by the Chairman re 21/03080/FUL & 21/03081/LBC.

Broadband Discussion: Mr Chris Taylor, manager of 'Connecting Shropshire' visited some Middlehope residents and then came to the meeting to give an update on the progress of broadband coverage for the parish, particularly in outlying small settlements which have little or no broadband. It transpired there are no current broadband connection plans for such areas as the cost is too high. As a result, DPC will be investigating other providers such as SWS, Airband and the Gigabit voucher scheme. A subsequent briefing paper from Mr Taylor is now on DPC's website.

Minutes of the Parish Council Meeting held on 23rd June 2021 were approved by councillors and signed by the Chairman. Five matters arising were dealt with.

Reports: *The Chairman* reported on issues he has dealt with this month. The collapsing road/wall in Bouldon has now become a large and complex repair job due to delays in repairing it. He had a meeting with PC Bridgwater about siting of last few SmartWater signs. He investigated and liaised with the Tree Team and local residents about trees being felled in Diddlebury. He had discussions about a possible house building matter in Sutton. He held discussions with Cllr Motley about DPC's CIL claim and the re-surfacing of the DVH car park and broadband issues. He also dealt with SC's queries about Data Protection and the FOI request concerning the Code of Conduct complaint.

Unitary Cllr Motley outlined the steps she has taken to progress the re-surfacing of the DVH car park: Kier is now being asked to do the work. She also spoke about the Environmental Grant and the Governance Review. Once the Governance Review commences it has to be completed within 12 months so she will call a meeting of Corvedale Chairs and Clerks in September to discuss parish issues in detail.

Reports were also received from Westhope and Diddlebury Village Halls and the Flood Action Group,

Planning: Three applications were considered: *21/03080/FUL* - Application for the erection of a first floor rear extension, alterations to rear porch and internal alterations, all to the modern extensions of Grade II Listed Bouldon Mill, Bouldon, and *21/03081/LBC* - listed building consent in connection with the above application. DPC voted to support these two applications.

21/03429/TCA - Application to fell 3 Leylandii trees within the Diddlebury Conservation Area, namely at Millfield, Mill Lane, Diddlebury. DPC voted to support this application.

Noting the appeal re 20/02519/OUT: This application, for 12 dwellings at The Moors View, Diddlebury, had been dealt with by DPC by a remote platform meeting on 12th June 2020.The plans etc. were made available at this meeting for anyone who had not been able to view them on line. DPC had not supported the application and SC had refused planning permission on 16th October 2020. The matter is now going to appeal. Details were provided to any residents who wish to lodge an objection with the Planning Inspector; objections have to be lodged by 9th August 2021. DPC has nothing further to add to the objections it has already lodged with the planning department.
